Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

There are several occasions in the Gospel when the opponents of Jesus lay traps for him in the hope of finding something to use against him. In today's gospel we have a clear example of such behaviour. When the scribes and Pharisees come to Jesus with a woman who has been caught committing adultery, they use her predicament to test him. If Jesus were to say that the woman should not be put to death, they could accuse him of disregarding the law of Moses. On the other hand, if he were to say she should be stoned, he would lose his reputation as a friend of sinners and belie everything he has said about mercy and compassion. As the story unfolds, we observe the wise reaction of Jesus in dealing with this difficult conundrum and his deep regard for an unprotected woman.

In ancient Greece, the great philosopher Socrates had a reputation of wisdom. One day he was approached by a lady who said, "Do you know what I am after hearing about your friend?"

"Just a moment", replied Socrates, "before you say anything more, I would like to test you with the three sieves".

"The three sieves! What do you mean - testing me with the three sieves?"

"Yes", Socrates replied, "before telling anything about another person, whether you have read it or heard it, it is a good practice to filter the information, and that's what I call the three sieves. The first sieve is the TRUTH. Have you checked if what you are going to tell me is true?"

"No, I just heard it".

"Very good! So, you don't know if it's true or false. We continue with the second sieve, which is KINDNESS. Whatever you want to tell me about my friend must be tested - is it kind?"

"Oh no! On the contrary".

"So", questioned Socrates, you want to tell me bad things about this person and you're not even sure if they are true? Maybe you can still pass the test on the third sieve which has to do with UTILITY. Is it useful that I know what you're going to tell me about this friend?"

"Not really".

"So," concluded Socrates, what you were going to tell me is neither true, nor good, nor useful. Why then did you want to tell me this?"

Re-opening of Drumduff and Seskinore Chapels

- People are pleased that the chapels will re-open on 2nd and 3rd April after two difficult years.
- Despite the easing of restrictions, we must be aware that the virus is still with us and is very contagious.
- We appreciate that some people are vulnerable, and others will be cautious about returning to Mass.
- It is important that people should feel confident that our chapels are safe places.
- We will continue to observe certain measures to ensure people's welfare.
- While not obligatory, it is recommended that people continue to wear face coverings.
- Anyone who has Covid symptoms or has been in contact with someone who has Covid should not attend Mass.
- As people enter the chapel, they will be asked to sanitise their hands.
- People should endeavour to observe social distancing.
- People are asked to observe the directions for the distribution of Holy Communion.
- Containers will be provided at the doors for the collection of envelopes/ donations.

Each chapel area is asked to draw up a rota to ensure there are sufficient helpers and stewards available at each Mass.
