

Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

You may have heard the story about the woman whose car stalled in heavy Friday evening traffic just as the lights turned green. All her efforts to start the engine failed miserably. Before long, a chorus of honking horns arose from the queue of vehicles behind her. Feeling just as frustrated as those other drivers eager to get home or to their various destinations, she finally got out of her car and walked back to the first driver and said very politely, "I'm terribly sorry, but I'm having trouble starting my car. If you'll go up there and give it a try, I'll stay here and blow that horn for you".

Our Celtic ancestors, accustomed to a slower pace of life, would be appalled at today's lack of patience and they would be totally amazed at the volume of traffic hurtling along broad paved roads at unimaginable speeds. Their idea of a road was a "bo-thar", a wide enough track where one cow could literally pass by another. But while we may be going faster and by more sophisticated means, we have to ask ourselves: Where are we heading? What's it all about?

On this second Sunday of Advent we meet John the Baptist, the only religious leader that Jesus ever sought out and spoke about with deep affection and admiration. He is described as a voice crying in the wilderness, a large presence that dominates the barren landscape. As patron of the Advent season, John reminds us that if God is to come into our lives, we have to prepare for his coming by mending our ways. In today's gospel we hear him calling us to conversion - inviting us to take a journey inwards, to the spiritual self which is always thirsting and hungering for God.

Unfortunately, the nature of today's lifestyle puts us under such stress that we are inclined to live on the surface of things with precious little time to reflect on what is important in life.

The images described by Isaiah and quoted in today's gospel are very powerful. "Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley". In other words, there is a belief that God can restore the landscape of our lives, transform the most difficult terrain and change the most challenging situations to our benefit.

And Isaiah concludes that piece with a truly beautiful image: "God is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes".

May the Lord bless your Advent journey. Monsignor Colum.
