

Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

Today's gospel will undoubtedly dispel some of our softer images of "little Jesus, meek and mild". When this man came into the Temple he was overcome with emotion and went wild with rage. Are we disturbed by this outburst? How can we reconcile such behaviour with someone who advocated compassion and asked his followers to turn the other cheek? I think it is important to appreciate the context and try to understand why Jesus' anger was roused.

The Temple was a sacred place, a place intended for the worship of God, but over time it had become a marketplace. Jesus was angry because the traders had not only desecrated this holy place, but they were exploiting the poor in the name of religion. The greedy hucksters and the crafty moneychangers were making huge profits from poor people's piety.

A prophet from a previous time had said that true religion means to act justly, love tenderly, and walk humbly with your God. In standing up for the truth by challenging the abuse of the sacred and defending the rights of the poor, Jesus was in effect signing his own death warrant.

On this third Sunday of Lent we might reflect on those temples we have turned into marketplaces today. Where have we turned sacred events into secular activities? We only have to think of the manic expenditure connected with weddings; the Christening parties that have become huge social events; the extravagance associated with First Communion and Confirmation ceremonies. Of course, all of that was before Covid 19 imposed its own restrictions and hopefully brought us to our senses. We pray in the words of Pope Francis, "May God bless us with anger at injustice, oppression and exploitation of people. And may God bless us with enough foolishness to believe that we can make a difference in this world, so that we can do what others claim cannot be done".

# International Women's Day, Monday 8th March

#### The 2021 Census

The 2021 Census takes place on 21<sup>st</sup> March 2021 and is co-ordinated by the NI Statistics & Research Agency (NISRA). The census happens only once every ten years and provides a picture of all the people and households in Northern Ireland. Next week all households in Northern Ireland will receive a census pack with details on how to complete.

The pack will contain an access code for completing online or details on how to request a paper form. Your answers are important and completely confidential. Your personal data will never be shared. As soon as you receive your pack you can complete your census.

This year the focus is on the suffering people of South Sudan, depicted by the two mothers Ajak and her friend Awut, who feature on the Trocaire box. Widowed by war and trapped in poverty, they are now fearful of the Covid pandemic. They have no hope without help.

This is what Fr James in Sudan writes, "We are going through deep pain. This is my cry to you: please do not leave us alone. Please give your support this Lent to my people in South Sudan. In their poverty, in their fears of war, in their traumatised spirit they are trying their best to come out of it. The child who is crying may be the future leader of this country who will transform this whole situation. We shall not give up and we shall always pray for you. Hold our

hands. Walk with us. We need your prayers. We need your support. With your help a good day can come for South Sudan."
