# Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

In today's readings - in the First Reading from the Book of Kings and then in St Mark's Gospel - we meet two women who are remembered for their generosity. From out of their extreme poverty, they gave everything they had. The widow woman in the Gospel who lived in a male dominated society would have been very vulnerable, without a husband to support her. So, by right she would have needed to hold on to the few coppers she had. Yet she didn't hesitate and very discreetly, as she thought, slipped in her two small coins.

And forever she takes her place in the Gospel, not because of the amount she gave, but because of the extraordinary generosity with which she gave it. We might be inclined to think then that today's readings are about making sacrifices and giving to others and being generous and good natured - and that would be right, they are about all those things, but I think they also have to do with attitude and seeing life from a different perspective. The gospel incident is linked with Jesus' teaching about the Kingdom of God and the reversal of world standards. It reminds us that Jesus uses a separate yardstick and a different value system. It calls to mind the truth that money cannot buy everything we need. Money can buy a house but not a home. Money can buy a bed but not sleep. Money can buy medicine but not health. Money can buy cosmetics but not beauty. Money can buy books but not wisdom. Money can buy luxuries but not happiness.

And I like the story of the football club who were overjoyed when they heard that somebody was going to make them a donation of  $\pounds 10,000$ . But they got a shock when the cheque arrived - the name of the club was specified and the amount was mentioned but there was no name and no signature on the cheque because the donor wanted to remain anonymous!

### **Trocaire East Africa hunger Crisis**

A terrible hunger crisis is raging across East Africa, driven by escalating climate change, swarms of desert locusts and the Covid-19 pandemic. Over 30 million children, women and men are being pushed into starvation. People and livestock are dying. Without emergency food and aid, many more will not survive. Lives depend on our ability to reach them. Trocaire staff are on the ground in the worst-hit regions. They are rushing emergency assistance into devastated communities to keep people alive, but the human suffering is enormous. The Irish Bishops Conference has agreed for an Emergency Collection to be taken up this weekend to help Trocaire at this difficult time. In Beragh Parish we will donate the regular weekly collection to this cause, and if anyone would like to make a further donation, please help if you can. We will be making our returns after next Sunday.

## **Covid 19 Wakes and Funerals**

When a person has died as a result of Covid 19, new regulations governing arrangements for wakes and funerals have come into effect from September 2021. Where there is a negligible risk of transmitting the Covid 19 infection, the remains of the deceased are allowed to be taken home and viewing is permitted. They can also be brought to the church for the funeral Mass. However, the regulations regarding numbers permitted to gather, social distancing, hand hygiene and face coverings must be observed. Anyone who has had a positive Covid 19 test result or anyone who is symptomatic should not attend.

## Week-end Masses

I am aware that some people in the parish are quite annoyed there is no Mass in St Malachy's, Seskinore on Sunday and no Mass in St Patrick's, Drumduff on Saturday evening, as was the practice in recent years. I share their disappointment, but unfortunately the situation is outside my control. I would love to be able to reinstate the arrangements we had prior to Covid-19. However, the current regulations regarding places of worship are determined, not by numbers in attendance, but by capacity. It is the responsibility of the parish to ensure that the building can safely accommodate people by ensuring the stipulated social distancing, in addition to the other protocols regarding signage, ventilation, and sanitisation etc. Given the size of Seskinore and Drumduff churches, it is not possible to have public week-end Masses until the Health Authorities and the Executive relax the present guidelines.

### Covid-19

While the Executive has decided to ease the restriction of face coverings in places of worship, Church leaders are encouraging people to continue to use them as a precautionary measure against the spread of infection.
