Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

The month of November - a month of gloom, wedged between the abundance of autumn and the expectation of Christmas joy. With its shifting seasons and changing cycle of nature, November reminds us that all life is constantly changing: trees stripped of their autumn colours, fields empty and forlorn, streetlights struggling to make a difference in the early morning mist.

It is the time of year when the weather is changing, and the days are getting shorter. Nature seems to be preaching her own silent sermon about the end of things. This is the time of year when the Church invites us to remember those who have gone before us 'marked with the sign of faith'.

Praying for the dead has always been an important part of our Catholic tradition and that practice is beautifully captured in the common custom of visiting their graves and writing out the family dead list at this time of year.

November is maybe a good time to think about our own mortality and to reflect on the many questions that come to mind: "Is there life after death? If so, what will it be like? Will I meet again my husband/wife/parents? What about the generations before them? And what about deceased babies who died before their time and those who were buried, so insensitively, outside consecrated ground?" These are honest questions that may poke at the heart as the chill wind grips you some November evening. For that reason, the following story might be relevant:

There were twin boys in their mother's womb. They noticed the umbilical cord and decided that their mother must love them very much, when she was prepared to share her very life with them. As time went by, they began to speculate about the possibility of birth and what lay beyond the womb. One of them was a budding atheist! "How do you know there's any life after birth? Have you ever seen anyone who was born? Has anybody ever come back to tell us? How do you know we have a mother? Maybe we only invented her for our own consolation!" After some time, the twins were born. When they felt safe to do so, they opened their eyes, and looked up into the face of their smiling mother. Then they looked at each other with a look which spoke volumes: "How could we have possibly understood something as beautiful and as wonderful as this?"
