

The Baptism of the Lord

9th January 2022



Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

There are few of us who can recall the day of our baptism. In the early Church, however, it was usually adults who were baptised. This followed a period of intense preparation which began during Lent and ended with the baptism of the new Christian at the great festival of Easter. When you attend the baptism of an infant today you will see how its symbols contain all of the most important elements that explain and express what being a follower of Christ means.

At the beginning of the ceremony, we have the anointing with the Oil of Catechumens on the child's breast. In the sports arenas of the ancient world, oil was used liberally by wrestlers and athletes to keep their bodies supple and to help them slip through the grasp of their opponents. Using oil in baptism reminds us of God's power and strength which we share and the support of God's help to enable us to escape the clutches of whatever evil things might hurt or enslave us on our journey through life. The oil is a power-filled symbol of God's partnership with the new Christian: "I have taken you by the hand...." says the Lord.

The most readily understood symbol of baptism is water. We know that we could not survive without this precious gift which brings new life to the earth and freshens and cleanses us in so many ways. We are also aware of the destructive power of stormy waters and the devastation of heavy floods. The waters of baptism remind us not only of its fertile and cleansing powers, but of the mastery of God over life's turbulent and dangerous moments. We need only recall Jesus standing with outstretched hands over the angry waves saying, "Be still!" or reflect on the words of today's responsorial psalm: "The Lord's voice resounding on the waters, the Lord on the immensity of the waters... the voice of the Lord full of power... the Lord enthroned over the flood".

Towards the end of the ceremony, we use the Oil of Chrism, a reminder of the oil used to anoint prophets, priests and kings of old. It signified their authority and holiness. The newly baptised person is given grace to be a priest, a bringer of God to others; a prophet, one who speaks the Word of God especially in matters of justice; and finally a royal person, one who is very special, not because of royal blood, but because of what St Peter says to Cornelius in today's second reading: "The truth I have come to realise is that God does not have favourites". By virtue of our baptism, we are adopted as children of God and we are called to carry on the work of his Son, the beloved.

May the Lord enable us to be faithful to our baptismal commitments and witness to Gospel values in everything we do and say.

Pathways - Adult Faith Development Programme

The aim is to improve the emotional wellbeing of the client. Covid 19 Wakes and Funerals

When a person has died as a result of Covid 19, new regulations governing arrangements for wakes and funerals have come into effect from September 2021. Where there is a negligible risk of transmitting the Covid 19 infection, the remains of the deceased are allowed to be taken home and viewing is permitted. They can also be brought to the church for the funeral Mass. However, the regulations regarding numbers permitted to gather, social distancing, hand hygiene and face coverings must be observed. Anyone who has had a positive Covid 19 test result or anyone who is symptomatic should not attend.

Week-end Masses

I am aware that some people in the parish are quite annoyed there is no Mass in St Malachy's, Seskinore on Sunday and no Mass in St Patrick's, Drumduff on Saturday evening, as was the practice in recent years. I share their disappointment, but unfortunately the situation is outside my control. I would love to be able to reinstate the arrangements we had prior to Covid-19. However, the current regulations regarding places of worship are determined, not by numbers in attendance, but by capacity. It is the responsibility of the parish to ensure that the building can safely accommodate people by ensuring the stipulated social distancing, in addition to the other protocols regarding signage, ventilation, and sanitisation etc. Given the size of Seskinore and Drumduff churches, it is not possible to have public week-end Masses until the Health Authorities and the Executive relax the present guidelines.

Covid-19

While the Executive has decided to ease the restriction of face coverings in places of worship, Church leaders are encouraging people to continue to use them as a precautionary measure against the spread of infection.
