

Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader

The Gospel readings for the first two Sundays of Lent always give us a glimpse of two extremes - evil and good. Last Sunday, we found ourselves with Jesus in the desert - that barren and lonely place, the place of hardship and temptation. There, weakened by hunger and wearied by loneliness, Jesus was urged by Satan to forgo his dream and take the easy option. In his humanity, Jesus was like us in all things, but sin. Yet relying on God's Word and with the help of the Spirit, Jesus was able to overcome temptation.

Today on this second Sunday of Lent, we find ourselves on the dizzy heights of a mountain, the place of holiness and glory. Here, in the company of Peter, James and John and in the presence of Moses and Elijah, Jesus is transfigured in radiant beauty. The apostles are given a glimpse of his divinity. Maybe it is no accident that evil and good, temptation and transfiguration, humanity and divinity are placed close together at the beginning of Lent.

During this special season we are asked to overcome evil and resist temptation. We are encouraged to make choices; choices between good and evil, choices that will transfigure us and change our behaviour. If we wish to change the outer aspects of our lives, we must first change the inner attitudes of our minds and hearts. Such change is always possible. History and literature are full of examples: Paul on the road to Damascus, Matt Talbot the alcoholic, Charles Dickens' miser Scrooge, to mention only a few. Something happened inside each of these, and they became different people.

Change sometimes requires the substituting of new habits for old ones. It calls for self-discipline. A person has to be firm and decide to do what needs to be done. The change of heart to which Lent calls us can be accomplished most of all through the power of prayer and the help of the Holy Spirit.

Today's gospel reminds us that there is no shortcut to glory. When things are difficult and the haul is long and wearisome, we need a vision, a glimpse of the glory to which we are called.

We remind ourselves that there is always darkness before there is dawn; there is always Calvary before there is Resurrection and there is always a Good Friday before there is an Easter Sunday.

Lord, each spring you renew the face of the earth.

May you also renew each one of us,

Help us to remain faithful to our Lenten promises so that we may be able to celebrate Easter with great joy and in newness of mind and heart.

Lenten Reflections in St Patrick's Cathedral, Armagh

On each of the Tuesday evenings during Lent, a guest speaker will join in St Patrick's Cathedral at 7.30 pm to help us reflect on each of the following themes. People may wish to join in person or via St Patrick's Cathedral Webcam.

Tuesday 15th March "Only in God is my soul at rest, in Him comes my salvation" (Sr Elaine Kelly)

Sr Elaine is a Poor Clare Sister, a native of West Belfast and a guide on The St Patrick's Way, hosting walks around the life and legacy of St Patrick in Co Down. She was a barrister at law for a number of years and a former Adoration Sister and lived in the community in Belfast. Sr Elaine says that she's now "living the dream" as a child of God in St James' Parish, Monksland, Co Louth and she lives in the community at Faughart Monastery, close to the birthplace of St Brigid.

Tuesday 22nd March "Covid-19" "The call to look forward in a spirit of hope" (Dr Bob Brown)

Bob lives in Armagh and he retired recently after working as Chief Nurse and Director of Community and Older Peoples Services in the Western Health and Social Care Trust. He now plans to continue some nursing practice while exploring a range of voluntary and community service opportunities. He's a member of St Mark's Parish and he hopes to develop a wellbeing and spiritual support service for people connected

with the Church. He's currently studying at the Church of Ireland Theological Institute and Trinity College, Dublin.

Tuesday 29th March "Finding God in a Pandemic World" (Oisin Walsh)

Oisin is from Trim, Co Meath and he has been working in the Catholic Communications Office in Maynooth, Co Kildare for the last three years. He's a man of deep faith and whilst working to help promote the Catholic Church throughout the country, he's also assistant to the editor of Intercom (a Catholic pastoral and liturgical resource.) He writes regularly on religious matters and his articles can often be read online and in the press. He's a gifted musician and he plays in a band.

Tuesday 5th April "Care for oneself amidst the challenges of life" (Stephen Donnelly)

Stephen has worked in the field of mental health for 30 years. A former mental health nurse, he's now employed by the Western Health and Social Care Trust as team lead for the regional trauma network and as a specialist Psychologist Trauma Therapist. He has delivered numerous courses/programmes on positive mental health and wellbeing. He resides with his family in Omagh, Co Tyrone and is a keen GAA enthusiast.

Tuesday 12th April "Grief - a process that's experienced one day at a time" (Paul Mallon)

Originally from Co Tyrone, Paul is a counsellor in a private practice in Armagh City. He also works with businesses and public sector organisations and is currently the resident counsellor in the Southern Regional College, Armagh. Having previously worked in engineering, he works as an Emotional Freedom Technique Practitioner. He has contributed EFT meditations to the recently launched "Sibling Grief Club", a local support group website for the bereaved.
