

The Assumption of Our Lady into Heaven 15th August 2021



Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

Some years ago, a priest friend brought me to see a statue of Our Lady of Clonfert in a little country church not far from Portumna in

Co Galway. I had never heard of it before and didn't realise that during the month of May thousands of people from various places come on pilgrimage to the parish of Clonfert, not to mention the people who come to pray throughout the year.

When we think of Mary, and especially on today's feast of the Assumption, we are inclined to imagine her heavenly beauty and glorious dignity as Mother of God.

The statue in Clonfert does not match such expectations - in fact it is far from elegant. It is carved from wood; Our Lady's left arm is missing, and the child's head has been damaged and repaired. But despite all of that, it exudes a warmth and a beauty that is very consoling. I think her brokenness is a perfect image for our world today.

Experts have dated the statue to the 12th/13th century and reckon it may have come from one of the monastic houses in that locality. During the time of religious suppression, the statue was hidden within a tree where it remained until the 19th century when it was discovered by a local man cutting wood.

The statue was taken for restoration to the National Museum and the following report compiled: 'The Holy Child is fully draped as was customary in the early 14th century. Unfortunately, most of the face and the top of the head have been restored with plaster. The right arm is broken off and the two feet are worn away. The Madonna's arm has been sawn off. Other parts are decayed, and the appearance of the whole figure has been spoiled by repainting. The Clonfert Madonna is not shown in distant solemnity but as the Mother of the Human Race. The gentle smiling Virgin has left her remote throne and stands, as it were, within reach of all, clasping her Child who turns to caress her with his hand and plays with a tress of her hair".

In 1932 the statue was put on show during the Eucharistic Congress of that year as evidence of the long-established devotion to Our Lady in Ireland.

Our Lady of Clonfert, I come to you as one of your children, who will never forget the importance of a woman like you. I come because I believe in you. I come to say thanks for the past and the present and ask you to bless me in the future. You know me, you know how I live, and you know my needs. Please help me, especially when I need you most. I have problems, worries and anxieties the same as everyone else, help me to cope. So often I would just love to give up when life

hurts me and people betray me, but give me the courage never to lose heart. Bless my family, my life, and my friends. No matter what happens to me, help me to believe to trust and to hope. Our Lady of Clonfert, pray for us.
