Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

In today's Gospel we are told that Jesus withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon (present day southern Lebanon) which was then a predominantly pagan area and where there was bitter hostility between the local Canaanites and the Jewish people. We are not told why Jesus ventured into such foreign territory, but much to the annoyance of his disciples, a local woman approaches them shouting and screaming and begging Jesus to help her little daughter who is very unwell.

Leaving aside all political and religious reservations, this Canaanite woman is more concerned about the welfare of her child and falling on her knees she pleads with Jesus to help her. There then follows one of the strangest exchanges between Jesus and another person - initially he seems to give her the silent treatment, followed by a quick rebuke which leads to light banter and eventually a recognition that this woman has something special : "Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted".

At one level this Gospel reminds us that we must welcome the stranger, respect the outsider, have time for the marginalised and show acceptance towards those who differ from us. Like the late John Hume, we should be in the business of building bridges between people and extending the hand of friendship to those who on life's journey are travelling on a different roadway than ourselves. We are being called to widen our horizons and to acknowledge an openness to those who are of a different background or social class. Today's gospel is a gentle reminder that we cannot possess God for ourselves and that God can never be the exclusive property of any one particular group. Every person is made in the image and likeness of Christ and deserves to be treated with dignity and respect, regardless of circumstances.

StopCOVID NI USE THE APP - SAVE LIVES

- This free app from the Health Service will support contact tracing, help prevent another lockdown and save lives.
- It tells you automatically if you've been near another app-user who tests positive.

It can also let them know if you test positive.

• It never knows or shares your identity or location.

What does the StopCOVID NI App do?

- It supports contact tracing and helps protect as many people as possible.
- The app uses Bluetooth technology to check if you've been in close contact with another app-user.
- It tells you if you have been near someone who has tested positive, even if you don't know them.
- If you receive an alert, it will tell you to self-isolate for 14 days and show you where to get advice on symptoms and booking a test.
- If you test positive, it updates app-users who have been in close contact with you.
- It only knows if you have been near another app-user, not your identity or location.

How do I download the App?

Download the app from your phone's app store.

This will be the Apple App Store for iPhones and the Google Play Store for most other phones. Search '**StopCOVID NI'**. You should see the app with its black and white HSC logo. Click '**Install**' or '**Get'**.

The app will then be installed on your phone. Open the app and follow the guidance to set it up. You will be asked to confirm you want to use the app, agree to the Terms and Conditions, and allow the app to use your Bluetooth feature to send you notifications.
