

Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

Leading up to the time of Jesus it was acceptable to apply the law of retaliation: "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth". In other words, it was alright to exercise revenge, strike back at those who caused harm and destroy the enemy. By contrast the words of Jesus in today's gospel, "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you, bless those who curse you and pray for those who treat you badly" would have sounded totally absurd. The extraordinary reversal of normal practice and the radical call to a different way of behaving would have seemed utterly ludicrous. Most listeners would have considered this teaching folly in the extreme. No wonder they wanted to get rid of him!

Today the teaching of Jesus is still radical and revolutionary because of our dog-eat-dog mentality; levelling the score and getting even is still very much the norm. We are invited, therefore, to model our behaviour on the life of Jesus who urges us to turn the other cheek, to give to those who ask and to be compassionate as God is compassionate. The teaching of Jesus prompts us to let go of our fears, to be generous with our forgiveness and allow God to take control of our lives.

Our world desperately needs people who can overcome evil with good and exercise forgiveness which is the hallmark of the Christian. Nelson Mandela once remarked that we make peace with our enemies, not with our friends. Consequently, the one who forgives is the one who has the greater strength. Not to forgive is to allow someone else have power over me. They are in my thoughts and my thoughts about them disturb my peace and annoy me so that I am in a constant state of dis-ease.

One of the petitions in the Lord's Prayer is where we ask God to forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us. When we say these words, we are in effect placing ourselves in a bind - we are putting a condition on God's forgiveness, and that condition is that God should forgive us to the extent that we forgive those who have hurt us. Who said it was easy to be a follower of Jesus Christ? !! With every blessing, Monsignor Colum.

Consultation

Archbishop Eamon Martin and Bishop Michael Router are inviting all of us during February to take part in the <u>Consultation</u> for the Universal Synod of the Church. They emphasise that our response, and the responses of various groups and organisations, across the Archdiocese, will be very helpful and will contribute greatly to a listening process that is taking place around the world.

However, because of Covid 19, many people are still cautious and might be reluctant to attend public gatherings. Therefore, the Synodal Core Group in the Archdiocese of Armagh are proposing an alternative means of participation.

They have organised a virtual consultation that will broadcast twice a day 3.00 pm and 8.30 pm, Monday to Friday, from 7th February to 25th February on the St. Patrick's Cathedral Webcam. The presentation lasts 45 minutes and it can be accessed through the Armagh Parish Website at www.armaghparish.net/cathedral-webcam. I would encourage people to avail of the opportunity to learn more about the Synodal journey and to make your response.

Easing of Covid 19 Restrictions

Once again, I offer our sincere gratitude to the Parish Covid Team and to all the other helpers who have ensured our wellbeing in coming to Mass during the past two years.

Following a very helpful meeting on Thursday evening, the following issues were discussed:

- The Omicron Variant of Covid 19 is prevalent within the community;
- We recognise that some people are vulnerable and others remain cautious;
- We appreciate parishioners' desire to have weekend Masses in all three chapels;
- We want to ensure that people feel comfortable and safe about returning to week-end Mass;

- It was agreed that we need to move gradually and carefully towards reopening the other two chapels;
- We wish to see families and young people return to the practice of weekend Mass;
- The Parish Bulletin in hardcopy would be appreciated by some;
- It was noted that wheelchairs are available in each of the three chapels, and these could be used to facilitate parishioners with mobility issues.

The following details were agreed:

- St Patrick's Drumduff and St Malachy's Seskinore will resume regular Masses on the weekend 2nd/3rd April 2022;
- Mass times will be: Drumduff Saturday Vigil Mass at 7.30 pm; Sunday Masses Seskinore at 10.00 am and Beragh at 11.30 am;
- The current regulations will continue for the time being: every person will sanitise hands before and after Mass; Holy Water will not be available at the entrance; parishioners should observe social distancing; no sign of peace; Holy Communion to be received in the hand and not the tongue; envelopes can be placed in collection boxes provided; seats will be sanitised after Mass;
- Face coverings should continue to be used;
- In each church area, we need to put in place teams of people to take responsibility for sanitising and cleansing of those buildings.

The following arrangements were proposed:

- Small teams of volunteers from Drumduff and Seskinore areas are required;
- In the near future there will be a full meeting of these people to discuss the practical details involved;
- In consultation with the Parish Safeguarding Team, we should consider reinstating altar servers;
- The current arrangements whereby the seats in Beragh chapel are sanitised every evening by those on the Rota List will now cease;
- Visitors to the chapel during the day will take responsibility for sanitising the place they occupy;
- Cloths and cleaning materials for this purpose will be made available;
- The necessary instructions and directions will be posted in the hallway.

Sunday Missal

Because we are still not allowed to distribute parish bulletins in paper form, some people regret not being able to follow the readings and prayers during Sunday Mass. It might be opportune, therefore, to consider purchasing a Roman Missal for the New Year, which would cover the 3-year cycle.
