

Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

In recent weeks we have been overwhelmed by terrible images and frightening news reports from various parts of Ukraine. As we look on in horror at the devastation of human life and the ruination of a country, we are at a loss to understand why bad things happen to innocent people. Something similar occupies the minds of those who question Jesus in today's gospel about two tragedies that had befallen people in Galilee. However, in this instance, they imply that somehow God was responsible or that those people were being punished for their bad behaviour. In reply Jesus asks, "Do you think that those people who died in that way were greater sinners than anyone else?" Jesus' answer is clearly a resounding "No". Trying to explain the origins of evil is senseless. We simply do not know. Jesus rejects the idea that personal misfortune is God's punishment for sin. Yet a serious illness or a sudden accident can serve as a wake-up call about how we live our lives. Today's gospel is an invitation to amend our ways with its clarion call to repent and its challenging image of the barren fig tree. We are called to go before the Lord with a harvest of good works, of generosity to those in need, of fidelity in the face of suffering and of dedication in sharing our faith with others....and we should act now.

Have you ever said, "I'll wait till tomorrow to do that"? Have you ever said that and then found that you left it too late or squandered the opportunity? In the gospel parable we are called to recognise God at work in our lives and respond to him. <u>Now</u> is the opportune moment.

Perhaps there have been times when you saw yourself like the fig tree in the parable - not much good, a useless failure, unable to achieve what you wanted. Then think of friends who came to you at such a time, people who saw your potential and were prepared to give you another chance, people who also dug the soil around you and gave you the encouragement you needed. Perhaps in your turn you have been able to do something similar for others! It is never too late, there is always the chance to make a fresh start.

Re-opening of Drumduff and Seskinore Chapels

Further to a meeting on Wednesday evening regarding the re-opening of St Patrick's, Drumduff and St Malachy's, Seskinore, the following points were raised:

- People are pleased that the chapels will re-open on 2nd and 3rd April after two difficult years.
- Despite the easing of restrictions, we must be aware that the virus is still with us and is very contagious.

- We appreciate that some people are vulnerable, and others will be cautious about returning to Mass.
- It is important that people should feel confident that our chapels are safe places.
- We will continue to observe certain measures to ensure people's welfare.
- While not obligatory, it is recommended that people continue to wear face coverings.
- Anyone who has Covid symptoms or has been in contact with someone who has Covid should not attend Mass.
- As people enter the chapel, they will be asked to sanitise their hands.
- People should endeavour to observe social distancing.
- People are asked to observe the directions for the distribution of Holy Communion.
- Containers will be provided at the doors for the collection of envelopes/ donations.

Each chapel area is asked to draw up a rota to ensure there are sufficient helpers and stewards available at each Mass.

Next Sunday Canon Benny will be here in the parish with further copies of this booklet £3 and an additional book on St Oliver Plunkett £5. Both are lovely publications.

Day of Prayer for Vocations

On Friday, 25th March, the feast of the Annunciation, parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Armagh are asked to pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood. We are fast approaching a critical situation, where the declining number of active priests means that some parishes will be reduced, and others will be left without a priest. There will be Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament from 2.00 pm until 7.30 pm in the Church of the Immaculate Conception, Beragh. Parishioners are encouraged to come and pray at any time but especially for the Holy Hour at 6.00 pm. Tuesday 22nd March "Covid-19 "The call to look forward in a spirit of hope" (Dr Bob Brown)

Bob lives in Armagh and he retired recently after working as Chief Nurse and Director of Community and Older Peoples Services in the Western Health and Social Care Trust. He now plans to continue some nursing practice while exploring a range of voluntary and community service opportunities. He's a member of St Mark's Parish and he hopes to develop a wellbeing and spiritual support service for people connected with the Church. He's currently studying at the Church of Ireland Theological Institute and Trinity College, Dublin.

Tuesday 29th March "Finding God in a Pandemic World" (Oisin Walsh)

Oisin is from Trim, Co Meath and he has been working in the Catholic Communications Office in Maynooth, Co Kildare for the last three years. He's a man of deep faith and whilst working to help promote the Catholic Church throughout the country, he's also assistant to the editor of Intercom (a Catholic pastoral and liturgical resource.) He writes regularly on religious matters and his articles can often be read online and in the press. He's a gifted musician and he plays in a band.

Tuesday 5th April "Care for oneself amidst the challenges of life" (Stephen Donnelly)

Stephen has worked in the field of mental health for 30 years. A former mental health nurse, he's now employed by the Western Health and Social Care Trust as team lead for the regional trauma network and as a specialist Psychologist Trauma Therapist. He has delivered numerous courses/programmes on positive mental health and wellbeing. He resides with his family in Omagh, Co Tyrone and is a keen GAA enthusiast.

Tuesday 12th April "Grief - a process that's experienced one day at a time" (Paul Mallon)

Originally from Co Tyrone, Paul is a counsellor in a private practice in Armagh City. He also works with businesses and public sector organisations and is currently the resident counsellor in the Southern Regional College, Armagh. Having previously worked in engineering, he works as an Emotional Freedom Technique Practitioner. He has contributed EFT meditations to the recently launched "Sibling Grief Club", a local support group website for the bereaved.
