

Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

"Let us cross to the other side" is an important phrase in St Mark's gospel which occurs several times in his account. In today's case it doesn't just refer to crossing the Sea of Galilee from one side to the other side; it might also suggest that Jesus is inviting the disciples to go a little deeper on their journey. Perhaps they are entering into the unknown, moving out of their comfort zones and therefore feeling anxious. The crossing of the water does not go well for the disciples. We might be able to relate to their sense of panic when the storm blows up and the water begins to swamp the boat. There may have been occasions when we too felt overwhelmed and frightened because the tides of life turned against us, and we were powerless to do anything about the situation. To the disciples' astonishment "Jesus was in the stern, his head on the cushion asleep".

In times of turmoil, we too may have felt totally abandoned, adrift in a storm where even Jesus appeared to be asleep. Like the people on the boat, we too may have cried out, "Master do you not care? We are going down!"

However, we take heart from today's gospel when we realise that Jesus is always with us, and he is the one who can rebuke the storm and restore peace. We are told, "the wind dropped, and all was calm again". As we follow the Lord into the unknown, we pray for greater maturity of faith and deeper trust in his plan. For that reason, I like the following reflection which I offer as a blessing to you:

"May the peace of Christ go with you wherever he may send you. May he guide you through the wilderness, protect you through the storm. May he bring you home rejoicing at the wonders he has shown you. May he bring you home rejoicing!"
