

# "You go into my vineyard too."

# Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

It is good to be chosen, but to be left aside can be humiliating. Some of us might recall the anxiety of standing in the schoolyard waiting to be called as teams were picked and desperately hoping that we wouldn't be left to the very end or worse still totally ignored!

Adult versions of the same scenario happen in real life: Cathy knows what it's like - after twelve years of marriage and three children, her husband no longer wants to be married. "He's away with a younger partner, a newer model", as local gossip crudely puts it. Seamus knows what it's like - three decades with the same company; a senior position becomes vacant. He should get the position, but the board have different ideas. They want youth - something Seamus doesn't have.

"A small guy in a tall world". "A lost ball in long grass". "One brick short of a load".

You can add your own phrase. If you've been there and this describes you, then you should feel at home with today's gospel. God has a

peculiar passion for the little ones, for those who are lost and rejected, for those who are forgotten, ignored or left on the margin. In answer to the question, "Why have you been standing here idle all day?" the men in today's parable reply, "Because no one has hired us".

Glancing through the gospels, it's interesting to observe where Jesus can be found and the people with whom he associates. See the hand of Jesus on the festered skin of the leper; notice how he responds to the touch of the woman with a haemorrhage; listen to how he speaks to the woman accused of adultery; observe him beckoning the small man Zacchaeus down from the tree; watch him at table surrounded by tax collectors and sinners. He says it himself: "The last will be first, and the first last"

The message is consistent. What society rejects, God cherishes. What the world writes off, God picks up. What others turn away, God gathers in. Today's gospel is also a reassurance that God does not reward our achievements but honours the way in which we respond to the opportunities that come our way. It is worth remembering that the Lord has selected you; you have been chosen by him and for him and he has a special place for you.
