Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

Somewhere I recall being told that a mystery is something that cannot be explained and that we can't fully understand. This might be correct, but it's not the full truth. Many of the most valuable things in life cannot be explained completely, but they can be experienced and appreciated. As St Bernadette once said about Lourdes, "To those who do not believe, no explanation is possible. To those who believe, no explanation is necessary." Today's feast of the Holy Trinity is also about appreciating and savouring the intimate love between Father, Son and Holy Spirit rather than trying to understand it. Such savouring cannot be rushed or manipulated; it is a gift of God. In

prayerful solitude we remind ourselves that we are in God's presence; we quieten the mind and heart to make space for God; we simply listen in stillness and peace. Nothing very apparent may happen, but what a loss it would be if we didn't take time to attune our spirit to God's Spirit.

St Augustine has been recognised as one of the most influential theologians in the Church. He longed to understand the doctrine of the Trinity and spent many years reflecting on ways to explain it logically. There is a story told that one day as he was walking along a beach, he saw a small child playing on the shore. The child, having made a hole in the sand, ran to the sea with a little cup, filled it with water and then ran back to pour it into the hole. Augustine watched in wonderment and then he asked, "Little child, what are you doing?" The child looked up and replied, "I am trying to empty the sea into this hole". "How is it possible," Augustine enquired, "that you can empty this immense sea into this tiny hole with that tiny cup? It is not feasible!" To which the child replied, "And how do you suppose you will ever comprehend, with your tiny mind, the vast immensity of God? It is not feasible."

One of the difficulties we have in trying to grasp anything about the mystery of God is related to language. We have to depend on human language and imagery to describe the indescribable. Elizabeth Johnson, a contemporary theologian, does that very simply: "The Triune God can be compared to a flowering plant with its deep, invisible root (God the Father), its green stem reaching into the world from that root (God the Son) which opens to spread beauty and fragrance and to fructify the earth with fruit and seed (God the Holy Spirit). And it is all the one living plant".

Essentially, the Trinity is about relationship. We can relate in different ways to God: at times we might relate better to God the Father, described as "tenderness, compassion, slow to anger, rich in kindness and faithfulness" (today's First Reading). At other times we might feel closer to God the Son who came into the world "not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved" (today's Gospel). At other times we depend on God the Holy Spirit to refresh us and to renew the face of the earth.

The last line of today's Second Reading gives us an early scriptural foundation for belief in the Trinity and is sometimes used at the beginning of Mass as a beautiful greeting. On this feast of the Holy Trinity, I make it my prayer for you - may the GRACE of Jesus be with you; may the LOVE of God be with you and may the FELLOWSHIP (friendship) of the Holy Spirit be with you.
