

Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

Forgiveness, like playing golf or learning to drive, sounds straightforward and simple in theory but the practice is a different matter. We could read all the relevant books and consider the benefits of forgiving another person, but when it comes to the crunch we find it very difficult to let go of resentment, utter those powerful sentiments, "I forgive you" and reach out the hand of friendship to those estranged from us. Forgiveness is a huge challenge.

Essentially forgiveness is about liberation - to forgive is to live and let live. A glance at any of the trouble spots around the world today reveals the effect of intransigence and the lack of forgiveness. Hatred and anger reign in so many places and suffering and violence continue unremittingly. The gospel message reminds us that wars cannot end, apartheid cannot cease, ethnic divisions cannot be healed, and famine cannot be controlled until someone says, "I am sorry".

Jesus calls on us, his followers, to take the lead in unleashing the energy of forgiveness which has such extraordinary potential to make things different. When I forgive another person, whether a neighbour or a member of my own family, I have begun the process of renewing the face of the earth. When I forgive another person, I free them from the burden of guilt and remorse and enable them to regain a sense of joy and peace. When I forgive another person, I free myself from the prison of resentment and anger and I experience a great sense of freedom and relief. Ultimately, forgiveness opens my heart to the forgiveness of God.

"And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother/sister from your heart!"

It is easy, however, to confuse forgiving with forgetting. Forgiveness does not mean that I won't remember what has happened or ignore the pain of the past. Forgiveness is an ongoing process that takes time to heal completely. Opening my hands to forgive and let go means that my hands are open to receive extraordinary blessings from God, who is all forgiving.
