

## Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

"So little time and so much to do" - that seems to be a common expression, especially since we have emerged from the Covid-19 lockdown. In some respects, we are catching up on those things that had to be cancelled or postponed while people attempt to balance time for work and time for family, doing shopping, driving children here and there, caring for elderly parents and juggling a host of other responsibilities. At the end of the day, some might feel they are sandwiched in the middle, trying to accommodate everyone - being all things to all people, and precious little to themselves.

A sandwich is an apt symbol - something that speaks of hurry and rush, grabbed quickly, filling a gap. A sandwich is usually swallowed, not savoured. During these days it could well happen that life swallows people up, and that's not good. While appliances may be designed more for replacement than repair, the human body is not. In today's readings there are several images that speak of a different pace: we have shepherds gathering the flock and looking after them as described by Jeremiah in the First Reading. There is the peace and unity referred to by St Paul in the Second Reading, while the green valleys with still waters of the Psalm beckon us back to a more leisurely lifestyle. In the Gospel we listen to Jesus advising his apostles to come apart to a lonely place where they can pause and reflect in order to realign their priorities and open their hearts to God.

In reality we might not be able to do much about the things life throws at us, but maybe we could slow down and be less hurried. Maybe as an antidote we could give more attention to whatever we do and be more present to whoever we are with. Maybe as Seamus Heaney says, we could *"some time, take time, to make time"*. That would seem to be the way of Jesus. It's also the difference between living and existing.

The appointments will be on a permanent full-time basis requiring 35 hours attendance each week, generally Monday-Friday. Flexibility in work pattern and hours worked will be requirements of these roles.

(Even though the Co-ordinators will work as part of a diocesan team, one will be based in the North and one in the South of the diocese).
