Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

Today is Mission Sunday. But Mission, we must understand, doesn't just refer to Asia, Africa or the Far East. Mission refers to all of us, here and now in our own locality. Faith, like charity, begins at home. Somebody has made the observation that to be a Christian and to be Missionary, we need three bones: a back bone; a wish bone; a funny bone.

- We need a back bone to stand firm when all else seems to waver; to speak boldly for Christ within a culture that is mainly concerned only with the things of this world; to act uprightly when it is so much easier to scheme, cheat or deny.
- We need a wish bone to dream dreams of a better world, to see beyond the confines of the present to the greener pastures of Christ's future where loneliness, anxiety and injustice give way to community, security and peace.

 We need a funnybone, to have the courage to laugh at our mistakes and to begin all over again, to realise that everything ultimately depends not on us but on the Spirit of Christ, to believe that the promises made by the Lord endure despite our weaknesses.

On this Mission Sunday we pray for the many Irish missionaries working in various parts of the world and we remember too the significant number of Irish men and women who lost their lives overseas because of violence and through sickness. Their example should encourage us to be willing to witness to Christ in the circumstances of our lives. St John Paul once prayed that the commemoration of such martyrs on Mission Sunday "would draw numerous young men and women to tread the same path of heroic fidelity".

In this Month of the Missions we might pray the Rosary by offering the first decade for Africa, the second decade for America, the third decade for Europe, the fourth decade for Oceania and the fifth decade for Asia. We could also add the following prayer:

"Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation. May your kingdom of justice, peace, love and forgiveness, be established in every land. In this time of coronavirus pandemic, we pray that your healing hand touch the sick, comfort the lonely and give new life to all. Be our companion on the road of life and help us to make your mission alive in our local community and throughout the world. Amen".

Covid 19 Wakes and Funerals

When a person has died as a result of Covid 19, new regulations governing arrangements for wakes and funerals have come into effect from September 2021. Where there is a negligible risk of transmitting the Covid 19 infection, the remains of the deceased are allowed to be taken home and viewing is permitted. They can also be brought to the church for the funeral Mass. However, the regulations regarding numbers permitted to gather, social distancing, hand hygiene and face coverings must be observed. Anyone who has had a positive Covid 19 test result or anyone who is symptomatic should not attend.





Stress Control online

Stress is a normal reaction to the rapidly changing and uncertain times we are all living in at the moment. If you are feeling a bit more stressed than usual and would like to learn some great ways, free-of-charge, to deal with common problems like anxiety, depression, panicky feelings, poor sleep and poor wellbeing then come along to our online Stress Control class.

'Stress Control' is a six-session cognitive-behavioural therapy class used extensively in community-settings by the NHS (UK) and HSE (Ireland) and across the world. You can find out more here: https://ni.stresscontrol.org/

As you can't come to a regular Stress Control class due to the current circumstances, Stress Control will come to you and live stream the sessions. Each session will be available on the YouTube channel from 9am and will be 62 hours after the start time. The sessions will be led by Dr Jim White, consultant clinical psychologist, who created the class and who has taught most of the NHS (UK) and HSE (Ireland) trainers who would normally be running classes across the country.

To take part:

- 1) Go to https://ni.stresscontrol.org/ where you can learn more about the class and get the dates. Everything you need to successfully complete the class the booklets, self-assessment, relaxation and mindfulness can be found in the 'Free zone'. If you can, please read, and start working on, the booklets in the 'Preparing for the course' section before Session 1.
- 2) On the homepage, click on the 'Stress Control Online' link to access our YouTube channel where the classes will be available to view at the scheduled times. If you click the 'Subscribe' button on our YouTube page (free), you will receive notifications when a new session is available. - 3) The session will begin exactly on time, so make sure you are there from the start. Sessions run for about 90 minutes and there will be a 10-minute break in the middle.
- 4) Each session is one piece of the jigsaw in tackling your Stress. By coming to each class, the jigsaw will form, and the big picture can emerge, making you better able to handle your stress. This is cognitive-behavioural therapy so it is crucial you practice the skills you will learn between sessions.

Life is very hard for us just now and there are no easy solutions or magic cures, but, with hard work and determination, we can boost our resilience to cope with these difficult times and come out the other end stronger. Please pass this on to anyone who you think might benefit from the class.

Week-end Masses

I am aware that some people in the parish are quite annoyed there is no Mass in St Malachy's, Seskinore on Sunday and no Mass in St Patrick's, Drumduff on Saturday evening, as was the practice in recent years. I share their disappointment, but unfortunately the situation is outside my control. I would love to be able to reinstate the arrangements we had prior to Covid-19. However, the current regulations regarding places of worship are determined, not by numbers in attendance, but by capacity. It is the responsibility of the parish to ensure that the building can safely accommodate people by ensuring the stipulated social distancing, in addition to the other protocols regarding signage, ventilation, and sanitisation etc. Given the size of Seskinore and Drumduff churches, it is not possible to have public week-end Masses until the Health Authorities and the Executive relax the present guidelines.

Covid-19

While the Executive has decided to ease the restriction of face coverings in places of worship, Church leaders are encouraging people to continue to use them as a precautionary measure against the spread of infection.
