Dear Parishioner and Gentle Reader,

The fourth Sunday of Easter is often referred to as Good Shepherd Sunday. Being a shepherd in Israel was not easy because it meant living on the fringes of civilisation. The shepherd had to contend, not only with the harshness and dangers of the wilds, but prolonged periods of isolation and loneliness. The shepherd had to be alert, constantly watching over the flock, leading them to fresh pastures and protecting them from all harm. The shepherd may have had a special place in the folklore of the Israelite people, but he had no place of importance in their society at the time of Jesus. Shepherds, like tax collectors and other outcasts, were at the bottom of the social scale.

So, when Jesus speaks of himself as the shepherd, he is clearly identifying with the vagabonds of society. He is the wandering prophet who has been rejected by his own people in Nazareth. He never lingers too long in the one place even when the people's hospitality is generous. Jesus will not be tied down - except when he is taken to Calvary. He is a pioneer rather than a settler. Every community needs both kinds of shepherd - pioneers and settlers - people who call the community away from stagnation and people who build up the community. Every person has a vocation to do one or the other. Let us pray for each other's vocation. And let us pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The need for dedicated men and women has never been greater, the demands never more challenging and the rewards never more worthwhile.

Our fundamental vocation is to be compassionate people with a mind through which Christ thinks, a heart through which Christ loves, a voice through which Christ speaks and hands through which Christ helps. He is depending on us.
